

# GREENPARK PRIMARY SCHOOL

## ENROLMENT SCHEME

EFFECTIVE FROM 21 JULY 2003

### Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below (and shown on the attached map) shall be entitled to enroll at the school.

The School will have a home zone which shall comprise all addresses in the following area:

- a. A line drawn from the centre point of Cameron Road and Oban Road in a westerly direction **(along southern side of the access way to Tauranga Golf Club & Tauranga Race Course)** as far as the Kopurereroa Stream, and then following the stream as far as SH 29 **(Bridge 13/6.22)**.
- b. A line drawn from Cameron Road in a easterly direction along Oban Road **(including all of Oban Road)** to the western boundary of Moreland Fox Park, and then following the boundary of Moreland Fox Park in an anti-clockwise direction around the outer perimeter of the park to Devon Street.
- c. A line drawn along the centre of Devon Street in a southwesterly direction **(including 23 & 27 Devon Street)** to the centre point of Kiteroa Street.
- d. A line drawn in an easterly direction along the centre of Kiteroa Street **(all even numbers, and all numbers from 46 Kiteroa Street to the end of the cul-de-sac)** to the intersection of Rawhiti Street.
- e. A line drawn along the centre of Rawhiti Street in a north east direction **(including all even numbers from 2 to 36 and uneven from 1 to 7)** to the power pylon on the eastern side of the Pooles Road and Rawhiti Street intersection.
- f. From this point a line heading generally east to Oropi Road, then across in an easterly direction to Waimapu Stream **(excluding Chadwick Road, Simmonds Grove & Knox Place)**.
- g. From this point a line heading generally northeast along the eastern bank of the Waimapu Stream and then along the southern edge of the Waimapu Estuary until it meets the eastern most legal boundary of Part Lot 1 DPS 20396 **(Bayshore Holiday Park)**. Then south east along that boundary to its intersection with State Highway 29 then following the highway to its junction with Poike Road.
- h. From this point a line heading generally south west in a curve and along the south eastern side of Waimapu Pa Road **(including all of Waimapu Pa Road)** to its end.
- i. From this point heading in a straight line west to meet with Oropi Road and continue in a southerly direction **(including Pukemapu Road)** until the city boundary **(No 333 Oropi Road and all of Wood Road)** is reached.

- j. From this point a line heading in a generally westerly direction following the boundary of the Tauranga District Council (**Pyes Pa Road to No 228 including northern side of Joyce Road to property number 65**) to its intersection with the Kopuereroa Stream, and then northwards along the stream to its intersection with State Highway 29 (**Bridge 13/6.22**).
- k. The southern and western boundary lines will border the enrolment boundaries of Pyes Pa, Oropi and Tauriko schools with no corridor between. For the avoidance of doubt, where any place of residence is partly inside and partly outside of the above area, it shall be deemed to be completely inside the area.
- l. Both Greerton Village School & Maungatapu Primary School provide access to reasonably convenient schools for students affected by this scheme. Neither school has an enrolment scheme.

Proof of residence within the zone may be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date that will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will enable the Board to assess the number of places that can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

### Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the Board will determine the number of places that are likely to be available monthly for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

<u>First Priority</u>	(special programmes – not applicable)
<u>Second Priority</u>	will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students
<u>Third Priority</u>	will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students
<u>Fourth Priority</u>	will be given to applicants who are children of Board employees
<u>Fifth Priority</u>	will be given to all other applicants

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth and fifth priority groups than there are places available, a selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary for Education under section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applications seeking second and third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
